

**SELECT BOARD MEETING  
OCTOBER 17, 2022 @ 6:00 PM  
Town of Plymouth Municipal Building**

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by board chairperson Jay Kullman.

In attendance were selectmen Keith Cappellini, Rick Kaminski, and Jay Kullman.

Also in attendance were Beth Graves-Lombard, Terry Bascom, Craig Obriskie, Bruce Pauley, Tina and Mark Fletcher, Willow and Terry Bascom.

Agenda topics were agreed upon by the selectboard with additional topics added.

First topic lightly touched on was the start of the budget process for the upcoming year, which will start next month to include cemetery funds.

Road commissioner discussed what the Town garage crew has been working on. Brush hogging the road sides, working on culverts, and grading the dirt roads. They've also been placing sticks with florescent orange tops to help the town crew in the winter months gage the edge of the roads while plowing snow.

Midge Tucker had sent a request to the Town for memory bricks to be placed in honor of previous town officials/workers; Ralph Michael, Sandra Small, Thomas Marrone, John & Bea Wheeler. Terry Bascom suggested she should submit a request through the Memory Tree. If it doesn't work through that avenue, the Town will revisit.

Rick and Larry met with the Cell Tower company out of Woodstock, Mac Mountain. They discussed the 40 ft tower that would look like a fiberglass light pole. In addition, they requested to bring in an engineer who would be testing the frequency range to determine the best placement of the pole. Jay called the owners of the tower on Messer Hill, and was told that they are still looking for carriers to lease the space. It's a work in progress and Rick will keep us informed of future development.

Keith Cappellini and Terry Bascom discussed the cannabis application. A portion of that discussion was to include the municipality fees. They are leaning towards the liquor license fees of other establishments in town to be consistent. Someone suggested inquiring with the Town of Rutland, since they already have a retail store up and running. The Plymouth Cannabis Control Board will continue to work out the details.

Next on the agenda was the First Constable, to include his duties and responsibilities. Jay reached out to the Ludlow dispatcher to inquire on what type of calls are received, and would a constable be able to respond independently. There would need to be a policy in place that would allow that person to determine if they could respond alone or call to get additional assistance. Setting up a call with the VT League for advice.

A question from the floor on the new owners of Hawk and what are their plans for the resort. It was suggested to invite them to a meeting and discuss.

The meeting adjourned 6:40 with the select board signing mail and warrants.
